Kathryn E. McGoldrick, MD, received her medical degree from Cornell University Medical College. She also has a B.M.S. degree from Dartmouth and a M.A. Privatum from Yale University. Dr. McGoldrick was a member of the faculty at Harvard Medical School then moved to Yale University School of Medicine. At Yale, Dr. McGoldrick attained the rank of Professor of Anesthesiology and was Medical Director of Ambulatory Surgery at Yale-New Haven Hospital. In September 2001, Dr. McGoldrick was named Professor and Chair of Anesthesiology at New York Medical College and Director of Anesthesiology at Westchester Medical Center.

Dr. McGoldrick has been named to “Best Doctors in America” on multiple occasions. She has published extensively in the medical literature and has lectured widely nationally and internationally. The author of more than 80 book chapters and 60 journal articles and has also authored/edited 17 books. Dr. McGoldrick served as Editor-in-Chief of the Journal of the American Medical Women’s Association and to Survey of Anesthesiology. She has also served as an Associate Editor of Clinical Decision Support: Anesthesia and was recently appointed to the Editorial Board of Current Reviews in Clinical Anesthesia.®

Dr. McGoldrick served as the President of the Connecticut State Society of Anesthesiologists, was elected to membership in the Academy of Anesthesiology, where she recently completed a term as President. She served as the President of the Board of Trustees of the Wood Library-Museum of Anesthesiology, on the Board of Directors of the Foundation for Anesthesia Education and Research, and on the Executive Committee of the International Association for Ambulatory Surgery. She was elected President of the Society for Ambulatory Anesthesia. Recently, she was voted to be the 2013 recipient of the Distinguished Service Award of the Society for Ambulatory Anesthesia, and she was also interviewed for the prestigious “Living History of Anesthesiology” series produced by the Wood Library-Museum of Anesthesiology. Dr. McGoldrick is a member of Alpha Omega Alpha Honor Medical Society.
